South Carolina Senate Confirms the Reappointment of Commissioner T. Scott Beck



The South Carolina Workers' Compensation Commission announces that the South Carolina Senate has confirmed the reappointment of Commissioner T. Scott Beck to serve an additional six-year term on the Commission. His term will run from June 30, 2026, through June 30, 2032. Commissioner Beck was also confirmed for another two-year term as the Commission's Chairman.

Commissioner Beck was originally appointed to the South Carolina Workers' Compensation Commission on June 30, 2008, by Governor Mark Sanford. In 2010, he was elected by the Commission as Interim Chairman and subsequently nominated by Governor Nikki Haley for reappointment in 2012, 2014, and 2016 as Chairman. In 2018, 2020, 2022, and 2024, he was re-appointed as Chairman by Governor Henry McMaster. He received a Bachelor of Science degree from Penn State University in 1981 and a Juris Doctorate from the University of South Carolina School Of Law in 1999.

Prior to joining the Commission, he served in various positions in law enforcement from 1979-1996 and most recently as an Assistant Attorney General from 2000-2008 prosecuting healthcare fraud cases. Commissioner Beck served as a City Councilman in North Augusta, South Carolina from 1993-1996, and was elected to the South Carolina House of Representatives, serving from 1996-2000. Commissioner Beck currently serves as President of the National Association of Workers' Compensation Judiciary (NAWCJ) and Past-President of the Southern Association of Workers' Compensation Administrators (SAWCA). He was inducted as a Fellow by the College of Workers' Compensation Lawyers (CWCL) in 2024 and is also a master member in the Stanford E. Lacy Workers' Compensation American Inn of Court.

Throughout his tenure at the Commission, Chairman Beck has contributed to the fair and efficient resolution of workers' compensation claims and has played an important role in the administration of South Carolina's workers' compensation system. The Commission congratulates him on his reappointment and thanks him for his continued service and leadership and his dedication to the citizens of South Carolina.
